



Academic Success







Success by Student Group


This display shows PARCC ELA & Math performance levels for each student group. No data is shown for groups with fewer than 10 students.



School Highlights

Academic Courses

The academic program includes the core classes of Literature and Language Arts, Mathematics, Social Studies, Science and PE. We also offer non-core classes to both 7th and 8th grade. 7th graders take Health and Technical Writing the 8th graders take Art and Agriculture, one class per semester. We also offer Special Education and ESL classes.

Career Development Courses and Programs

Every other year at the end of the school, MRJHS invites approximately 20 -25 guests to a two-day Career Fair. The students learn about the job these people do and the type of education needed to perform these duties. During the course of every year we have a variety of events that start our students thinking about life beyond the next six years.

Physical Education, Heath and Wellness

All students at MRJHS participate in a forty-minute physical education class everyday. Over the course of the year they take part in a variety of units including the usual sports such as football, basketball, softball, soccer, and track events. They also are exposed to other sports like badminton, lacrosse, pickle ball, and weight lifting.

Athletics

The extra-curricular activities provided by MRJHS include football. boys and girls basketball, wrestling. volleyball, and track. We also have scholastic bowl, band and chorus that the students can participate in at both the conference and state level.

Other Programs and Activities

MRJHS students have the opportunity to become a part of the Student Council. This group of students, with the assistance of their supervising teacher plan assemblies, dances, and special weeks throughout the year which aids in the climate and culture of the building. Our VOICE program meets after school and helps with homework and tutoring needs.


