






## **Academic Success**


All Illinois students in grades 3-8 take the IAR assessment each year. High school students take the SAT in English Language Arts and Math.







# **Success by Student Group**



# **School Highlights**

## **Academic Courses**

The academic program includes the core classes of Literature and Language Arts, Mathematics, Social Studies, Science and PE. We also offer non-core classes to both 7th and 8th grade. 7th graders take Health and Technical Writing the 8th graders take Art and Agriculture, one class per semester. We also offer Special Education and ESL classes.

## Physical Education, Heath and Wellness

All students at MRJHS participate in a forty-minute physical education class everyday. Over the course of the year they take part in a variety of units including the usual sports such as football, basketball, softball, soccer, and track events. They also are exposed to other sports like badminton, lacrosse, pickle ball, and weight lifting.

## Other Programs and Activities

MRJHS students have the opportunity to become a part of the Student Council. This group of students, with the assistance of their supervising teacher plan assemblies, dances, and special weeks throughout the year which aids in the climate and culture of the building. Our VOICE program meets after school and helps with homework and tutoring needs.

#### School Awards

For the last several we have been designated as a "Relay For Life" school due to our yearly fund raiser and our sponsoring a relay for life event every other year. We have also been recognized by the IESA with the Division Sportsmanship Award for displaying excellent sportsmanship throughout the year.

# School-Level Finance
